In many Asian cultures, most prominently Japanese and South Korean, knowing someone's blood type is as common as knowing their zodiac sign, and apparently it's just as telling.

Believe it or not, blood type can influence someone's destiny and behaviour. Most of you who like surfing the Internet might have known about this information, but it is still essential for you to know about this fact.

According to Wikipedia, a blood type is just a classification of blood based on the presence or absence of inherited antigenic substances on the surface of red blood cells. Antigens can include proteins, carbohydrates, glycoproteins and glycolipids.

There are four basic blood types, A, B, AB and O. Almost 40% of the population has O+ blood. If you have type O blood, you must receive Type O blood. This is why 50% of the blood ordered by hospitals is type O. 7% of the population has Type O negative and is the choice for

accident victims and babies. The other reason Type O blood is requested is that it can be used in an emergency for all other blood types.

In Japan, there has always been a belief that blood type can classify one's personality. As an example, Type A can be creative and sensible, fastidious and over-earnest. Type B can be wild and active, selfish and irresponsible. Type AB can be cool and rational but critical and indecisive. Type O can be vain and rude, but agreeable and sociable.

It's not unusual to find that blood types play a prominent role in some cultures when Facebook lists blood type right along with relationship status. Work assignments are meted out according to blood type despite its discriminatory implications. Anime and manga authors have been known to include blood types in the description of their characters, and even films have been made about this unique phenomenon, such as one entitled, "My Boyfriend is Type B."

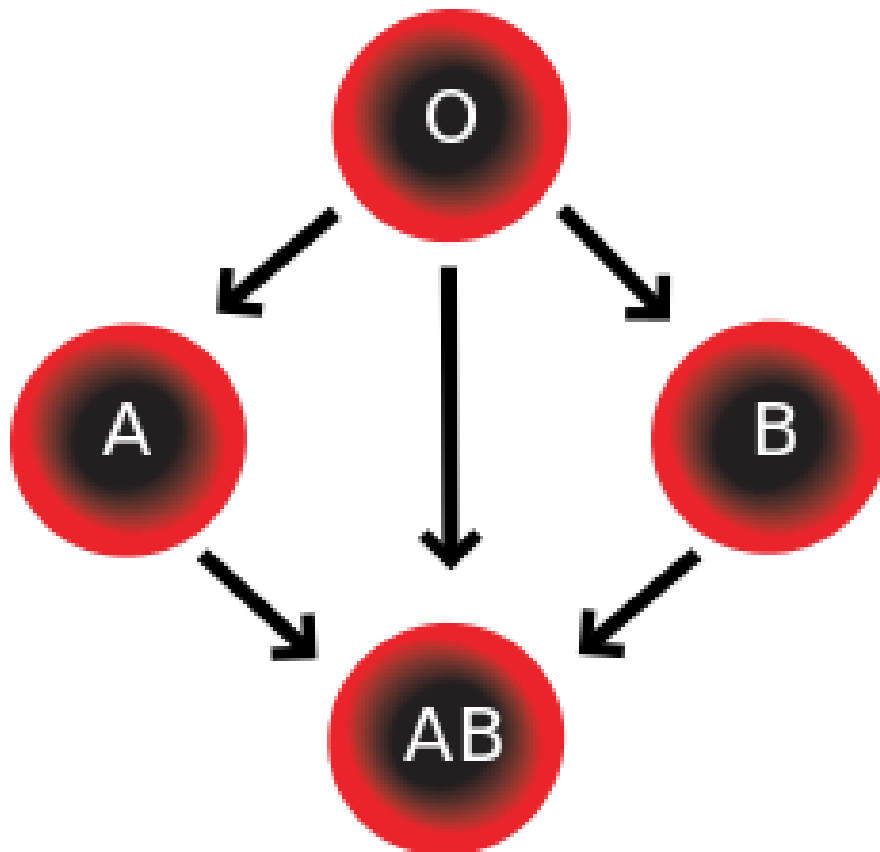
In this special guide, we will take a look into the different blood types and how it can affect your behavior and even your destiny.

So, let's explore!

Understanding Blood Types

The human body contains around 8 to 10 pints of blood depending on the size of the individual. However, the composition of the blood is not the same in each person. This is what makes the person's blood type.

Blood types are determined by the presence or absence of certain antigens – substances that can trigger an immune response if they are foreign to the body. Since some antigens can trigger a patient's immune system to attack the transfused blood, safe blood transfusions depend on careful blood typing and cross-matching.



What Are Blood Types?

All blood carries antigens, substances that alert the immune system to spring into action, and each person carries a unique antigen makeup, falling into general groups—what we have come to know as Landsteiner's blood types. While it would be several decades until the exact chemical makeup of antigens were discovered, with help from scientists like Elvin Kabat, Landsteiner laid down the basics.

The four major groups are decided by if they do or do not have two antigens, commonly known as A and B. Each of these antigens have an Rh factor, a positive or a negative. That's what leads to the commonly known blood types A+, A-, B+, B-, O+, O-, AB+, AB-.

Immunology has shown that there are over 600 types of antigens, and that some people don't even have an Rh charge. Those with Rhnull are sometimes described as having "golden blood" for their blood's potential healing qualities, but rare blood types often lead to complications to the people who live with them.

What Determines Blood Type

It is very important to know your blood type especially when you encounter accidents that induce blood loss. You should understand that not all types of blood can be mixed. In fact, if you mix one type of blood to another that is incompatible, this can be very dangerous to your health and may cause immediate death. A lot of people wonder why they have different types of blood. If you want to know the answer too, continue reading below.

The reason why people have different blood types can be attributed to the different compositions of blood particularly pathogens and proteins. These compositions that are found mainly on the RBCs create a defining characteristic for every person. This discovery has been uncovered in the early years because of the effects of blood transfusions.

Experts have found out that there are blood types that are incompatible to each other leading them to study further on the blood of people. After many years, they have concluded that people basically have four types namely A, B, AB and O which can either be positive or negative.

Blood types are inherited and represent genetic markers from both parents, so the answer to this question depends on the blood types of the parents.

Each biological parent donates one of their two ABO alleles to their child. If both parents are Type A, for example, then their children must also all be Type A.

But if parents have different blood types (any combination of A, B, and O) you can — and likely will — see variations among the blood types of their offspring.

Identical twins will always have the same blood type because they were created from the same fertilized egg (fraternal twins can have different blood types — again, providing the parents do — because they are created by two fertilized eggs).

It's possible for a pregnant woman to carry a fetus with a different blood type than her own, and sometimes the mother forms antibodies against

the red blood cells of the fetus, leading to low fetal blood counts. This fairly common condition is known as hemolytic disease of the newborn.

Why Are Some Types Of Blood Incompatible To Others?

The main reason is the antigens. For instance, when type A is transfused to a person with type B, the antigens will react by damaging the cells of each other.

This is because the cells of type A sees the cells of type B as enemies. It could also be that the plasma of type A is not a good environment for the cells of type B to thrive. As a result, the cells die and the patient is exposed to great health risks.

Knowing your type of blood is also helpful in finding out the blood types of your family members. Using the punnet square, you can predict the possible blood types of your offspring. For instance, if you are AB and your spouse is O, your offspring will have a 50% chance of being A and a

50% chance of being B. This method has produced many cases wherein some people discovered that they were just adopted and not really the biological children of their parents.

Finding Out Your Blood Type

The process of finding out the type of your blood is not that complicated. There are several ways to find out your blood type, and if you're eligible the easiest way is donating blood. You'll likely receive your blood type results in the mail a few weeks later.

Calling a doctor who has drawn your blood earlier could also work. All the doctors have to do is to get a sample of your blood. After that, they will test your blood by mixing it with antigens of types A and B. The way your blood will react will determine your blood type.

If the blood agglutinates or come together, it is an indication that your blood is reactive to the antigens. It is also important to know if your blood is RH negative or RH positive. RH negative can be quite complicated especially in terms on childbirth.

But if you can't give blood or don't have access to a past doctor, there are kits on Amazon for under ten bucks.

As a last resort, you could always ask your parents. Blood types are often passed down to children, and while you won't be able to narrow your blood type down precisely, you can at least approximate what your blood type might be thanks to a helpful chart like this one. Blood Types In Relation To Your Personality

Spend any length of time in Asian countries like Japan and you will at some point inevitably be asked what your blood type is. One may be taken aback by this at first. In Japan, the question, “What’s your blood type?” is as common as “What’s your sign?” in America. Japanese researchers have found a link between blood types and personality traits.

In Japan, using blood type to predict a person's character is as common as going to McDonald's and ordering a teriyaki burger. The association is akin to the equally unscientific use of astrological signs by Americans to predict behavior, only more popular. It is widely believed that more than 90 percent of Japanese know their blood type.

Japanese popular culture has been saturated by blood typology for decades. Dating services use it to make matches. Employers use it to evaluate job applicants. Blood-type products -- everything from soft drinks to chewing gum to condoms -- have been found all over Japan.

Was there an accident?

Do they need a blood transfusion and this is a desperate plea for help?

These things may flash through your mind in response to such a bizarre and off-kilter question. However, rest assured it is actually nothing of the sort. Indeed, in Japan this is akin to asking someone what their star sign is, but with the added weight that many people really truly believe it. Welcome to Japan, where your blood truly makes you what you are.

A Brief History

There is a long history of belief in the idea that the blood influences our character and even our destiny, and this was being investigated well back into history. Aristotle spoke of this possible connection, and the great Hippocrates also sought to establish a solid link between the quality of one's blood and personality.

This all got a boost of sorts in 1901, when the Austrian scientist Karl Landsteiner established the ABO system of blood grouping, which places human blood into four basic types: A, B, O, and AB, and which also won him a Nobel Prize.

Although this groundbreaking research would pave the way for safer blood transfusions and save countless lives, it also unfortunately opened

the door for these concrete blood types to be twisted and used by eugenics theorists as a basis to judge people based on blood type alone, giving the ancient belief in a connection with blood and personality a basis in reality for them.

This was most famously carried by the Nazis, who sought to use blood types as a basis to establish a stronger claim of racial superiority and purity, but it also found its way to Japan in the 1920s, when the country was quite militaristic and looking for ways to find the perfect soldiers for different duties or roles.



In 1926, an article was published in the Army Medical Journal entitled Blood Type Biological Related by Rin Hirano and Tomita Yashima, establishing the pseudoscientific idea that blood types were a reliable indicator of one's personality and aptitude in different areas. This work

would be followed up on by a professor named Takeji Furukawa the following year, in an article titled “The Study of Temperament Through Blood Type,” in the scientific journal *Psychological Research*.

This was all presented as serious scientific research, and the Japanese government and populace ate it all up. Before long there were whole military units divided by blood type, and officers were invariably promoted or assigned based on this.

They also used it to racist ends, using blood type as a basis for widespread discrimination against the Taiwanese and the indigenous Ainu people of Hokkaido, funding numerous studies in an effort to prove they were mostly of one blood type or the other.

This all slowly went out of fashion in later years, but was brought back in a big way in the 1970s, when new books on blood types started becoming popular, in particular those by a journalist and author named Masahiko Nomi, who between him and his son published dozens of books on the matter, and the whole practice became en vogue again.

Many other books on the subject have followed, and they are frequently best sellers in Japan.

Popularity

In Japan, discussion of blood types is widely popular in women's magazines as a way of gauging relationship compatibility with a potential or current partner. Morning television shows feature blood type horoscopes, and similar horoscopes are published daily in newspapers. A series of four books that describe people's character by blood type

ranked third, fourth, fifth and ninth on a list of best-selling books in Japan in 2008 compiled by Tohan Corporation.

No less than two-thirds of people in several East Asian countries and areas, such as Japan, Korea and Taiwan, believe in the association between blood types and personality.

In addition, according to one Japanese survey, more than half of Japanese people are fond of talking about blood type and personality. The research also says that people in Japan like blood-typical personality diagnosis and 1. talk about it with proper knowledge, 2. believe some relationships exist between blood type and personality, 3. feel its traits are applicable to themselves to a certain degree. Results of two other surveys are the same.

Although there is no proven correlation between blood type and personality, it remains popular with the many matchmaking services that cater to blood type. In this way, it is similar to the use of astrological signs, which is also popular in Japan. Asking one's blood type is common in Japan, and people are often surprised when a non-Japanese does not know their own blood type.

It is common among anime and manga authors to mention their character's blood types and to give their characters blood types to match their personalities. Some video game characters have known blood types. In addition, it is common for video game series to allow for blood type as an option in their creation modes.

Facebook in many Asian countries allows users to include their blood type in their profile.

After then-Reconstruction Minister Ryu Matsumoto's abrasive comments towards the governors of Iwate and Miyagi[39] forced him to step down from his post, he partially blamed his behavior on his blood type, saying "My blood is type B, which means I can be irritable and impetuous, and my intentions don't always come across." [40]

Blood types are important in South Korea as well. The Korean webcomic *A Simple Thinking About Blood Type* depicts the stereotypes of each blood type, and has been adapted as a short anime series in Japan as *Ketsuekigata-kun!* in 2013 and 2015.

Going Forward

The practice of asking for people's blood type and of basing a horoscope of sorts around it took off, particularly among young women, who believed it was integral to finding a compatible mate.

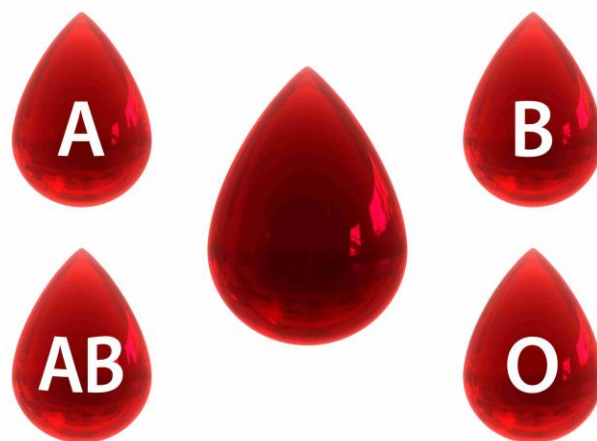
Countless magazines, books, and TV shows in Japan have continued to talk about the influence of blood type on abilities and personality right up into the present, and the extent of how much a person's blood type has influenced decisions in Japanese culture even in modern times is a bit startling.

Some baseball or other sports teams have based recruitment based on blood type, and companies routinely ask potential job prospects to write their blood type down on resumes. It is known that some kindergartens even divide classes into blood types, and some companies structure

entire divisions, duties, and leadership positions based on blood type. There are even whole product lines for things such as shampoo, chewing gum, and soft drinks marketed and catering to certain blood types, and there are whole diet programs devoted to what works best for people of one blood type or another. It is all rather bizarre to say the least.

There have even been public scandals revolving around blood type, such as in 2011, when Minister for Reconstruction Ryu Matsumoto resigned after making insensitive statements to local officials in the wake of the big Fukushima earthquake and publicly blamed his blood type B for it.

The dark side of all of this is the potential for discrimination based on all of this, of which there is unfortunately plenty. People have been turned down for jobs based on their blood type, or assigned into roles they were not suited for simply because their blood type deemed them appropriate for the job.

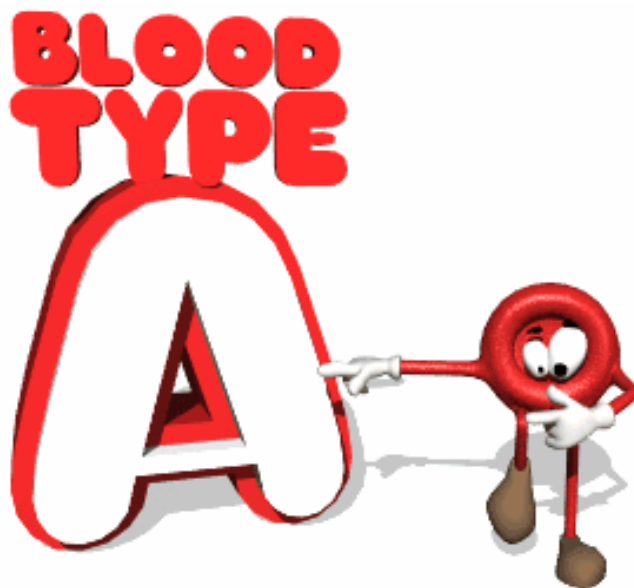


The idea of blood types holding sway over one's characteristics is also huge in the dating scene, where your blood type can easily determine whether a woman or man decides to go out with you or not. Bullying based on blood type is also common, and there is even a word for this in Japanese, bura-hara, or "blood harassment." Considering that it is estimated that 80% of Japanese people between ages of 20 and 49 truly believe in this blood type personality theory, this is kind of a big deal.

So, in the next chapters we will look into each blood type and what they say about a person's personality.

Blood type A

Most of the Japanese population is type A. People with this blood type are described primarily as kichōmen, or well-organized. They like to keep things neat but can be stubborn and get stressed out easily. They also value harmony with others. Agricultural people are the root of blood type A, and it's been said working collaboratively on farms developed these blood type personality traits.

Approximately 42 percent of the US population has Type A blood.

Famous Type A blood types include Britney Spears, Ringo Starr, and, gasp, Adolf Hitler.

People with blood type A have a deep-rooted strength that helps them stay calm in a crisis situations when everyone else is panicking.

However, they tend to avoid confrontation, and feel very uncomfortable around people. Type A's are the most artistic of the blood groups.

A types are shy and sometimes withdrawn. They seek harmony and are very polite, but all the same feel that they never really fit in with others.

A types are very responsible. If there is a job to be done, they prefer to take care of it themselves. These people crave success and are perfectionists. They are also very creative, and the most artistic of all the blood types, most likely because of their sensitivity.

People with blood type A are also likely to be considered classic "type A's": stressed and conscientious. People in this blood type personality are very stubborn and are easily stressed. They have high levels of the stress hormone cortisol, and this makes them intense. They do not like fights, and they prefer to be in harmony with everyone, and they like to work in collaboration with others in the community. They tend to keep to themselves more so when they do not want to share their ideas or opinions. Some of the most common personality traits of blood type A are as follows. They are kind, shy, stubborn, attentive, composed, polite, tense, withdrawn, reliable, perfectionist, sensitive, responsible, tactful, timid, mild-mannered, anxious, earnest, reserved, and polite.

The best personality traits of people with blood type A are gentle, loyal, organized, consistent, loyal, and perfectionists. Their bad personality traits are, obsessive, pessimistic, overly sensitive, fastidious, stubborn, and easily stressed.

As friends, people with blood type A are very reliable and trustworthy. If you are in trouble, then you can rely on friends with this blood type. They do not like to show their emotions, and they keep their thoughts or feeling about things hidden from others, and they share only when comfortable.

Kind and compassionate individuals who put others' interests and needs before their own. While they may seem calm on the outside, they often suffer from inner turmoil and anxiety.

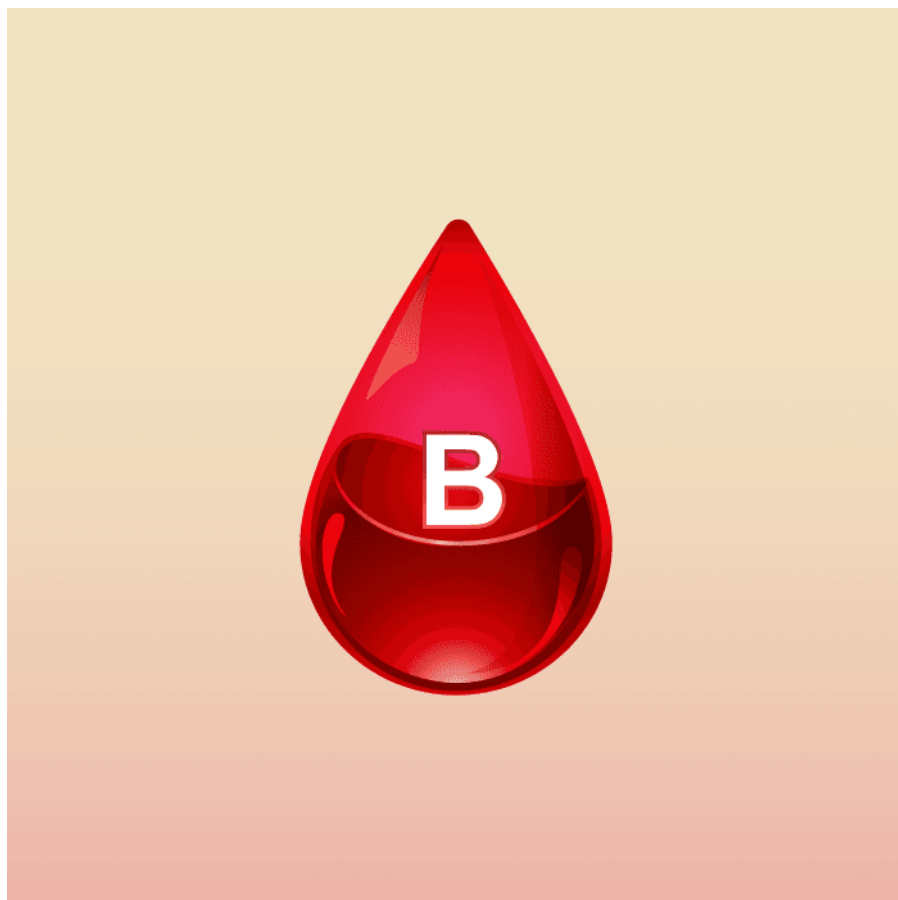
People with blood type A personality are excellent listeners and make good friends. Although they get along with others quite well, it is often achieved at expense of their own balance and happiness. To be liked by others they bottle up their emotions, which takes its toll on their nervous system. It is beneficial for them to take time alone and rest well.

The best jobs for this personality type are jobs that don't require much contact with other people like programmers, accountants, writers or librarians.

What about love? They are most compatible with their own type or AB type.

Blood Type B

Blood type B is generally described as jikochū, or selfish. They are also known for their creativity. Blood type B has a strong sense of curiosity, but at the same time, loses interest easily. Though there are a lot of positives to B types, people tend to focus on the negatives for reasons we'll get into later. Some say their root is in nomadic peoples who roamed from place to place.

In the United States, 10 percent of the population has Type B blood.

Famous Bs are Leonardo Di Caprio and Jack Nicholson.

People with blood type B are the most practical of the blood groups. They are specialist in what they do. They are Goal oriented and strongminded.

People with this blood type are famous for their creativity. They make their decisions very quickly, and they are not good at taking orders. When they focus on something, they put their all into it, and they are unlikely to let go even if the goal is unachievable. They have a very strong drive or desire to be the best at anything that they have set their minds to do. Nevertheless, they are poor at multi-tasking, and they are likely to neglect other important tasks and put all their focus on whatever they have set their mind on at the moment.

When they start a project, they spend extra time understanding and trying to follow directions than others might. When they are doing something, all of their attention is focused on it. They tend to stick to a goal and follow it through to the end, even if it seems impossible. They tend to be less than cooperative, as they like to follow their own rules and their own ideas.

Type B's are individualists of the blood group categories and find their own way in life. B type people pay attention to their thoughts a little more than their feelings, and therefore can sometimes seem cold and serious. People with blood type B are often considered more relaxed, freewheeling, and unconventional than other types, although not necessarily to an unacceptable degree

People with blood type B tend to be curious and interested in everything. They also lean to have many hobbies. If they are interested in something, they will be buoyant, but unfortunately they will be bored fast. However, they can choose the most important thing for them to do.

They lean to want to be number one in anything rather than just to be average people. But, they usually ignore another activity if they have focused on a certain activity. In other words, they cannot do some activities at the same time.

They look cheerful, enthusiastic, and bright. But, they are actually not like their appearances. Indeed, they are antisocial with many people. They are rugged individualists who are straightforward and like to do things their own way. Unluckily, their insistence on being independent can sometimes go too far and become a weakness.

Type Bs are optimistic, fun-loving, adaptable, happy-go-lucky, carefree, attention seekers, flexible thinkers, resourceful, creative, pragmatic, individualistic, wild, and unpredictable.

Outgoing and friendly, this type is a people person. Unlike the type A, the type B doesn't do that at expense of their own feelings and well-

being; it comes to them naturally, without any effort. Contact with people doesn't wear them off and they will do great as leaders or at any type of job that requires dealing with people.

The type B is highly adjustable; they can feel people. They are into body language and other methods of deciphering others. People with the blood type B personality type rely on their intuition and trust themselves.

Blood type B people can be thoughtful and empathetic. They are good at understanding other people's point of view and do not like challenging or confronting others. People with blood type B make good and reliable friends.

They face a lot of discrimination because of their negative personalities such as selfishness and uncooperativeness at times. The society mainly focuses on the negative side of people with blood type B, even though they also have their good side. As a result, they tend to be loners, and they isolate themselves from others.

Some of the most common positive personality traits of people with blood type B are such as curious, relaxed, strong, adventurous, creative, passionate, active, outgoing, and cheerful. Once again, they are most compatible with their own personality type and AB. Talking about discrimination, Korean women consider men with the blood type B personality not suitable for marriage due to their playful and flirty disposition.

Blood type AB

Blood type AB is a hybrid of A and B, two different personalities mixed together. They are often seen as dual-natured and complicated. For example, they are shy like A types, but also are outgoing like type B. Blood type AB is the rarest in Japan (and many other places in the world, too), so they are hard to find. This reinforces the stereotype that AB people are are kawarimono, or eccentric.

Fewer than 4 percent of the population has Type AB blood.

Famous AB Types include Marilyn Monroe and Mick Jagger.

People with blood type AB are hard to categorize, they are the split personalities of the blood groups. They can have characteristics on both ends of the spectrum at the same time. For instance, they are both shy and outgoing. They easily switch from one opposite to another.

Blood type AB is a mix of A and B personality types. People consider them complicated and double-sided. For instance, they can be outgoing just like Bs and shy like As. At times, people view them as having double personalities, and they keep their true personalities from strangers. It is hard for a stranger to instantly decide which personality people with blood type AB have until they get to know them. They are the rarest blood types in the world.

ABs are popular and charming, and they make friends easily. When in the company of an AB blood type personality, there can never be a dull moment. They are fun and exciting friends to have around. Small stuff

does not bother blood type AB personalities, but they are poor in handling stress.

ABs are empathetic, and they are always careful when dealing with others. They make sure that they consider other people's point of view. People with blood type have exceptional logical and analytical skills, and they are seen as humanists.

AB people are trustworthy and responsible, but can't handle it when too much is asked of them. They don't mind doing favors or helping out, as long as it is on their own conditions. People with this blood type are interested in art and metaphysics.

AB is considered the worst blood type. In predictability-loving Japan, they're loose cannons. They also like to set their own conditions and reserve the right to drop out when things don't meet their expectations. They're known to be sensitive and considerate at times but it just isn't enough to balance out the flaws in this blood type. For a while, some companies tried dividing their employees into work groups based on blood type, and no one wanted to work with the AB group.

People with blood type AB have sensitive and soft feeling. They have profound interests with other people's feelings and always face other people with care and beware. However, they also tough with themselves and people close to them. Thus, they lean to have two personalities.

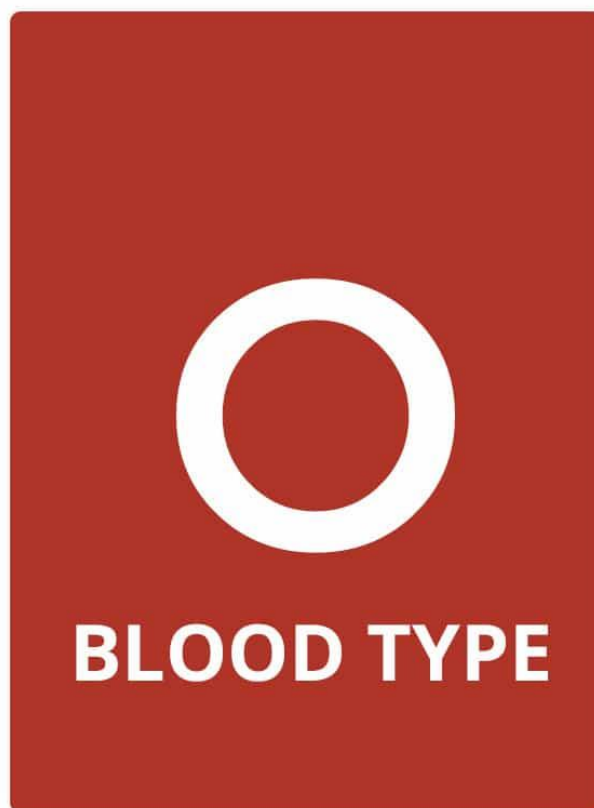
They are usually grudge people and think something too deep. Fortunately, they have a lot of friends, but they also need time to be lonely to think their own problems.

Type AB people are said to be cool, controlled, complicated, mysterious, have an interest in various things, unique, artistic, unpredictable, spiritualistic, sensitive, rational, sociable, but also a bit stand offish.

Freedom-loving AB's are strong and rational people. They don't worry about little things and usually can assess their life challenges without emotions getting in the way. Despite their love for freedom and independent thinking, they don't have any issues when it comes to relationships and are quite popular.

Blood type O

Blood type O is often described as rakkanshugi, or optimistic. They are outgoing, have leadership abilities, and are able to set the mood for groups of people. They don't care much about little things (as you can see from the mikan picture above), so their behavior sometimes freaks out more sensitive A types. Though they're often late to events (and sometimes rude), O types are incredibly resilient and flexible, enabling them to roll with the punches.

An estimated 44 percent of the US population has Type O blood...with 7 percent having Type O Negative, the “universal donor” type. Because it is the most frequently transfused type, Type O donors are always needed.

Famous Os include Queen Elizabeth II, John Lennon, Elvis Presley, and Paul Newman.

People with blood type O's are outgoing, energetic, and very social. They are the most flexible of the blood types. They are initiators; they easily start up projects but often have trouble following through because they give up easily. They are flighty and not too dependable.
